

# 2018 BadgerCare Plus DHS P4P Measures

Total of 14 measures (10 HEDIS, 4 HEDIS-like)

The State of Wisconsin's Pay for Performance (P-4-P) initiative is a program based on the state withholding a predetermined percentage of the capitation payments made to each HMO; this withhold can be earned back based on performance relative to quality goals below. These capitation payments from the state are one of the main revenue streams iCare receives to run our business.

The measures below represent the targets for the 2018 BadgerCare Plus P4P program to achieve to get a high, medium, or low rating.

<b>Antidepressant Medication Management- Continuation (AMM)</b> – Percentage of members 18 years of age and older who were diagnosed with a new episode of major depression and treated with antidepressant medication, and who remained on an antidepressant medication for at least 180 days (6 months).	>=41.1%	39.3% – 41.0%	<=39.2%
<b>Breast Cancer Screening (BCS)</b> – Percentage of women MA enrollees 50 to 74 years of age (denominator) who had a mammogram to screen for breast cancer (numerator).	>=65.5%	63% – 65.4%	<=62.9%
<b>Comprehensive Diabetes Care - HbA1c Testing</b> – Percent of diabetic members whose most recent HbA1c test during the measurement year is ≤9.0%.	>=90.1%	88.9% – 90%	<=88.8%
<b>Comprehensive Diabetes Care - HbA1c Control &lt; 8</b> – Percent of diabetic members whose most recent HbA1c test during the measurement year is ≤8.0%.	>=63.1%	56.9% – 63%	<=56.8%
<b>Controlling BP (CBP)</b> – Percentage of members 18–85 years of age who had a diagnosis of hypertension (HTN) (denominator) and whose BP was adequately controlled (<140/90) for members 18-59 years of age and 60-85 years of age with diagnosis of diabetes or (150/90) for members 60-85 without a diagnosis of diabetes during the measurement year (numerator).	>=63.1%	56.9% – 63%	<=56.8%
<b>Childhood Immunization (Combo 3) (CIS)</b> – Percentage of children 2 years of age who had four diphtheria, tetanus and acellular pertussis (DTaP); three polio (IPV); one measles, mumps and rubella (MMR); three H influenza type B (HiB); three hepatitis B (HepB), one chicken pox (VZV); four pneumococcal conjugate (PCV); two hepatitis A (HepA); two or three rotavirus (RV); and two influenza (flu) vaccines by their second birthday. The measure calculates a rate for each vaccine and nine separate combination rates. <b>Note:</b> Children must receive the required number of rotavirus vaccinations (two doses or three doses). <b>Initiation and Engagement of AOD Treatment – Engagement (IET)</b> – Members with a new episode of alcohol or other drug dependence (AOD) between January 1 and November 15 (Intake period) who had one of the following: An outpatient, intensive outpatient, or partial hospitalization visit with a diagnosis of AOD / A detoxification visit / An ED visit / An inpatient discharge with a diagnosis of AOD/ A negative diagnosis history (AOD within 60 days) • <b>Initiation Phase:</b> Members who initiate treatment through an inpatient AOD (Alcohol or other drug dependence) admission, outpatient visit, intensive outpatient encounter, or partial hospitalization within 14 days of the diagnosis. • <b>Engagement Phase:</b> Members who initiate treatment and have two or more additional services with a diagnosis of AOD within 30 days of the initiation visit. <b>Note:</b> When the Initiation of AOD treatment and the initial date of service during the intake period (January 1 – November 15) occur on the same day, they must be with different providers.	>=16.1%	12.3% – 16%	<=12.2%

<p><b>Follow-Up After Mental Health Hospitalization - 30 Days (FUH 30)</b> – Percentage of discharges for members who were hospitalized for treatment of selected mental health disorders and who had an outpatient visit, an intensive outpatient encounter or partial hospitalization with a mental health practitioner.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 30-Day Follow-Up = An outpatient visit, intensive outpatient encounter or partial hospitalization with a mental health practitioner within 30 days after discharge.</li> <li>• Includes outpatient visits, intensive outpatient encounters, or partial hospitalizations that occur on the date of discharge.</li> </ul>	<p>&gt;=74.1%</p>	<p>65.4% – 74%</p>	<p>&lt;=65.3%</p>
<p><b>Timely Prenatal Care (PPC)</b> – Percentage of deliveries of live births between November 6 of the year prior to the measurement year and November 5 of the measurement year that received a prenatal care visit as a member of the plan in the first trimester or within 42 days of enrollment in the plan.</p> <p>&gt; Must be enrolled 43 days prior to delivery through 56 days after delivery.</p> <p>&gt; This measure is an admin and hybrid measure.</p>	<p>&gt;=88.6%</p>	<p>79.9% – 88.5%</p>	<p>&lt;=79.8%</p>
<p><b>Post-partum Care (PPC)</b> – Percentage of deliveries of live births between November 6 of the year prior to the measurement year and November 5 of the measurement year that received a postpartum visit for a pelvic exam or postpartum care on or between 21 and 56 days after delivery.</p> <p>&gt; Must be enrolled 43 days prior to delivery through 56 days after delivery.</p> <p>&gt; This measure is an admin and hybrid measure.</p>	<p>&gt;=69.4%</p>	<p>64.4% – 69.3%</p>	<p>&lt;=64.3%</p>
<p><b>Tobacco Cessation Counseling</b> – Percentage of members 12 years of age or older who were identified as tobacco users and who received tobacco cessation counseling during the measurement year.</p> <p>The member is compliant if he or she received counseling to quit smoking either face-to-face or by phone as identified by a claim or encounter code.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <u>Striving to Quit</u>- Members that received tobacco cessation treatment through the Quit Line or First Breath count in the measure.</li> </ul>	<p>&gt;=68.8%</p>	<p>63.6% – 68.7%</p>	<p>&lt;=63.5%</p>
<p><b>Dental Visit - Children (ADV-Children)</b> – Percentage of members 2–20 years of age who had at least one dental visit during the measurement year.</p> <p>&gt; Dental Practitioner = Doctor of Dental Surgery (DDS), Doctor of Dental Medicine (DMD), Certified and licensed dental hygienist, dental services provided by a physician also count.</p> <p>&gt; Only applies to members who reside in Milwaukee, Racine, Kenosha, Waukesha, Ozaukee, and Washington counties.</p>	<p>&gt;= 54.9%</p>	<p>48.9% – 54.8%</p>	<p>&lt;=48.8%</p>
<p><b>Dental Visit - Adults (ADV-Adults)</b> – Percentage of members 21–64 years of age who had at least one dental visit during the measurement year. &gt; Dental Practitioner = Doctor of Dental Surgery (DDS), Doctor of Dental Medicine (DMD), Certified and licensed dental hygienist, dental services provided by a physician also count.</p> <p>&gt; Only applies to members who reside in Milwaukee, Racine, Kenosha, Waukesha, Ozaukee and Washington counties.</p> <p>&gt; Member needs to be enrolled in the same HMO continuously for 11 months of the measurement year.</p>	<p>&gt;=36.7%</p>	<p>31.5% – 36.6%</p>	<p>&lt;=31.4%</p>

## 2018 BC+ P4R Measures

The State of Wisconsin's Pay for Recording (P-4-R) initiative is a program used by the state to introduce measures that will likely become P4P measures in the coming year or two.

To complete these measures, we just need to provide proof that they were performed during the measurement period.

Preventive & Screening Measures	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Adult BMI (ABA)</b> - Percentage of MA enrollees 18-74 years of age (denominator) who had an outpatient visit and whose body mass index (BMI) was documented during the measurement year or the year prior the measurement year (numerator).</li> <li>• <b>Adult access to preventive care (AAP)</b> - Percentage of members 20 years and older who had an ambulatory or preventive care visit. 20 years and older as of Dec 31. No more than one gap in enrollment of up to 45 days. <i>[Administrative measure]</i></li> <li>• <b>Adolescent immunization (IMA)</b> - Percentage of adolescents 13 years of age who had one dose of meningococcal conjugate vaccine, one tetanus, diphtheria toxoids and acellular pertussis (Tdap) vaccine, and have completed the human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine series by their 13<sup>th</sup> birthday. No more than one gap in enrollment of up to 45 days during the 12 months prior to the 13th birthday.</li> <li>• <b>Children/adolescent access to preventive care (CAP)</b> - Percentage of members 12 months–19 years of age who had a visit with a PCP. No more than one gap in enrollment of up to 45 days during the measurement year.</li> <li>• <b>Well-child visits in first 15 months (W15)</b> - Percentage of members who turned 15 months old during the measurement year and who had zero to 6 well-child visits with a PCP during their first 15 months of life. Continuous enrollment from 31 days to 15 months of age less on gap of no more than 45 days.</li> <li>• <b>Well-child visits in the Third, Fourth, Fifth and Sixth years (W34)</b> - Percentage of members 3-6 years of age who had one or more well-child visits with a PCP during the measurement year. No more than one gap in enrollment of up to 45 days during the continuous enrollment period.</li> <li>• <b>Adolescent well care visits (AWC)</b> - percentage of enrolled members 12–21 years of age who had at least one comprehensive well-care visit with a PCP or an OB/GYN practitioner during the measurement year. No more than one gap in enrollment of up to 45 days during the measurement year.</li> </ul> <p><u>Well child visits must include:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- A health history.</li> <li>- A mental developmental history.</li> <li>- Health education/anticipatory guidance</li> <li>- A physical developmental history.</li> <li>- A physical exam.</li> </ul>
